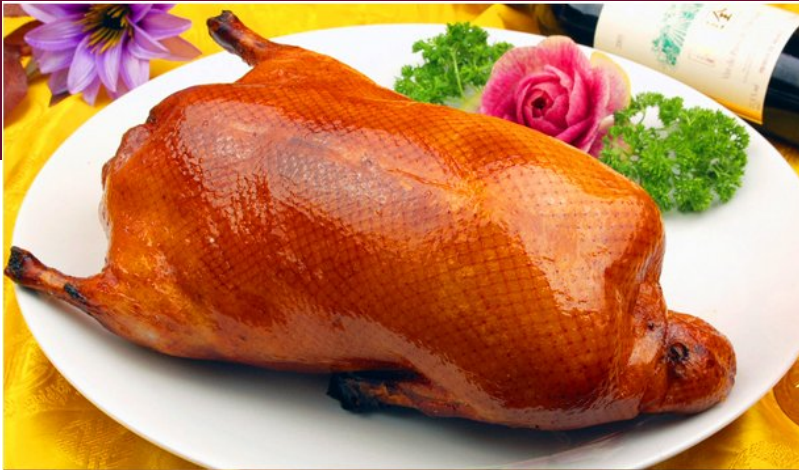
### Small Talk
