Idioms

new blood

new people who will bring in new ideas and skills (often to replace people who have been there too long)

"This office is filled with old people waiting for their pensions. It's time we got rid of the dead wood and brought in some new blood."

no pain, no gain

(spoken) only through hurt can you have success

"Stop crying, you baby. No pain, no gain. If you want to be a professional footballer, you've got to be fitter. Now run, you fat pig!"

not my cup of tea

not what I enjoy

"You go ahead, but I am staying here. You might like paintball, but running around in the mud pretending to be a soldier is not my cup of tea."



Structural Phrase: In short (review)

to quickly re-say a long point; to summarise

The company is going to need to downsize: reducing staff, finding a smaller office, and spending less on marketing. In short, there is going to be major change in how we manage things.
