Grammar: People vs. Persons

<u>Modern Usage</u>: Generally 'person' is used for the singular. 'People' is used for the plural.

1 person, 100 people

<u>Technical Usage</u>: Technical, legal and formal English uses an older definition. This helps it emphasise the responsibilities of individuals, even when they are in a group.

'People' = the population/group as a whole 'Person' = an individual 'Persons' = more than one individual

Saying 'persons' means that, although acting with others, the decisions, responsibilities and legal consequences are treated independently (not as a group).

'The persons involved will be prosecuted' - each individual will be prosecuted (not prosecute the group as a whole)

'No more than 10 persons allowed' - Although the individuals are independent (they may not know each other), no more than 10 are allowed
