Grammar: Should Have & Shouldn't Have

Uses: 1. Regret

I failed my test; I should have studied harder I feel sick: I shouldn't have eaten all those hamburgers

2. Strong judgement against others

I've been worried about you. You should have called! They're going to get divorced because of you. You shouldn't have kissed her!

Linking Phrases: Deduction

then - If she wasn't here then it couldn't have been her.

in other words - 'He bought the wrong cake, and then forgot to meet her' 'In other words: he's an idiot.'

<u>in that case</u> - 'She's a bit angry with you.' 'In that case I had better go home early tonight.'

otherwise - She must not know, otherwise why would she still be here?

<u>this implies that</u> - *He has begun hosting fundraisers. This implies he is thinking of running for mayor.*

if so/not - Did you do it? If so, you only have yourself to blame.

in essence - The company has no money, and the creditors are asking for their cash. The company is, in essence, going under.
