

Western Culture: Martin Luther King Day

- The third Monday of January is Martin Luther King, Jr. Day in America.
- It celebrates the life and work of Civil Rights
 Activist Martin Luther King. King was born on January 15th, 1929
- It is an official holiday, meaning people get the day off work
- It has been celebrated since 1986 (although only in every state since 2000)
- Initially some people disagreed with the idea of having a holiday for King. Some said it was too expensive; some that only government people should have a day; some didn't agree with King's politics
- Stevie Wonder's song 'Happy Birthday' was written to encourage people to support the holiday
- The Super Bowl, America's biggest sporting event, cancelled plans to have the game in Arizona in 1993 because Arizona did not support the holiday
- Only 3 people have holidays named after them in America: George Washington, Christopher Columbus, and MLK
- Putting holidays on Monday is popular because it becomes a 3-day weekend
